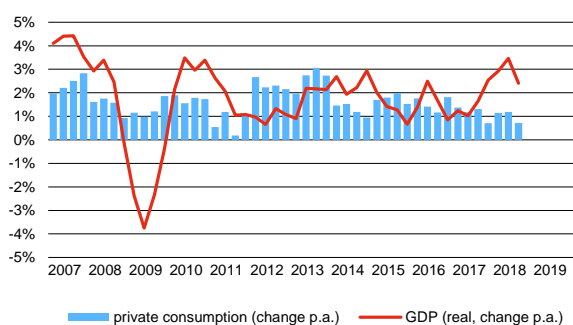


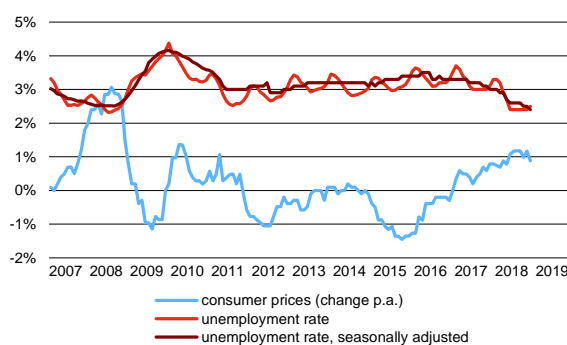
- SECO: The Expert Group is significantly lowering its forecast for GDP growth in 2018 and 2019. This is mainly due to weak domestic demand. Nevertheless, due to the strong first half of the year, GDP growth for 2018 overall is likely to come in well above average at 2,6%. As of 2019, the global economy will continue to normalise after the strongly expansionary phase of 2017 and 2018. GDP is set to grow by 1,5% in 2019 and by 1,7% in 2020.
- KOF: Despite the fact that growth in GDP for the third quarter of 2018 was negative, the Swiss economy remains in fairly good shape on the whole. KOF expects GDP to rise by 2,6% in 2018. Consumer spending will become a key driver of economic activity over the forecast period. Unemployment will continue to fall owing to the robust performance of the economy. KOF is forecasting that GDP growth will be slightly lower at 1,6% in 2019 before rebounding to 2,1% in 2020.
- The PMI of procure.ch/Credit Suisse reached 57,7 points in November 2018, which was virtually on a par with the previous month's level (+0,2 index points). This evidently marked the end of the downtrend seen in the PMI in the previous two months.
- The new conditional inflation forecast of the SNB for the coming quarters is lower than it was in September 2018. The medium-term inflation forecast is also slightly lower owing to more moderate growth prospects. For the year 2018, the SNB continues to anticipate inflation of 0,9%. The forecast for 2019 has been revised down from 0,8% to 0,5%; for 2020, from 1,2% to 1,0%.

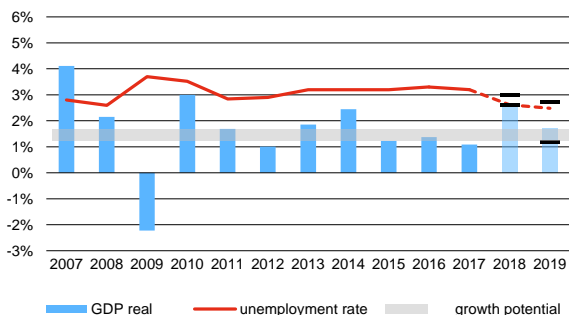

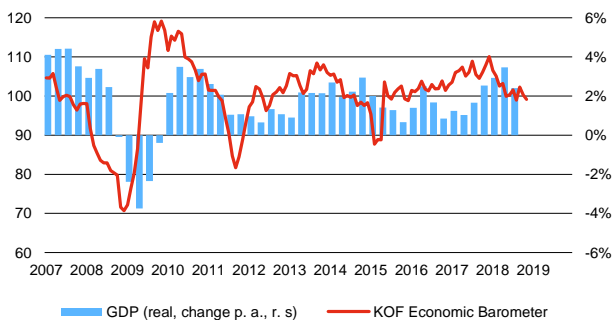
4 Evolution of GDP (real) and unemployment rate

5 KOF economic barometer

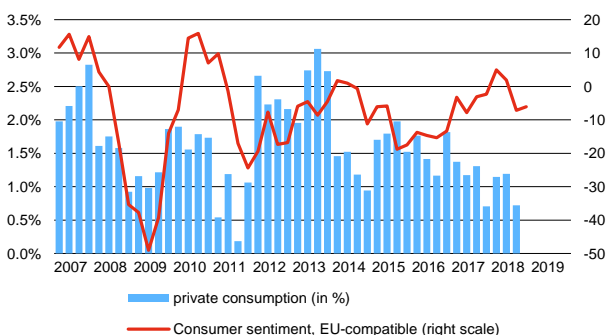


– The KOF Economic Barometer falls for the second time in a row in November 2018. With a level of 99,1 points, the Barometer is now slightly below its long-term average again. The Swiss economy will find the water slightly more difficult to navigate.

Note: The KOF Economic Barometer is a composite leading indicator for the Swiss economy. It comprises 219 variables which are combined based on statistically determined weights. It is one to two quarters ahead of the GDP growth rate of the previous year and thus enables an initial estimate to be made of how the Swiss economy will perform

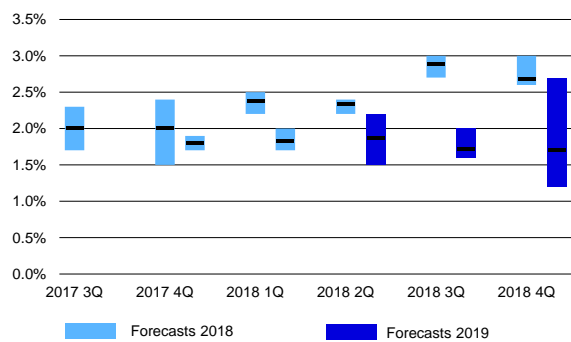
6 Private consumption and consumer sentiment

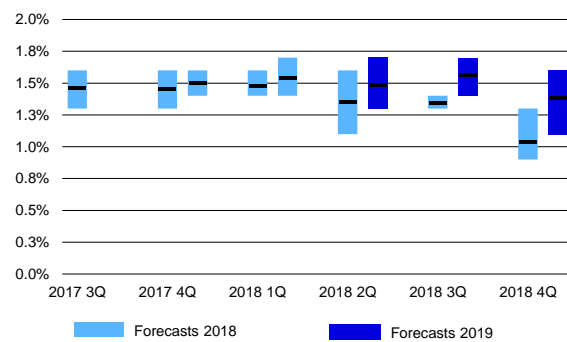

7 Evolution forecasts GDP



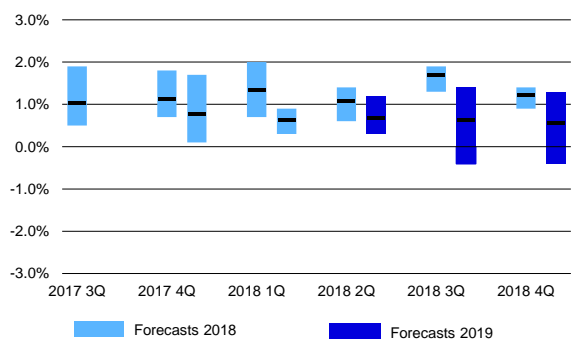

8 Evolution forecasts private consumption



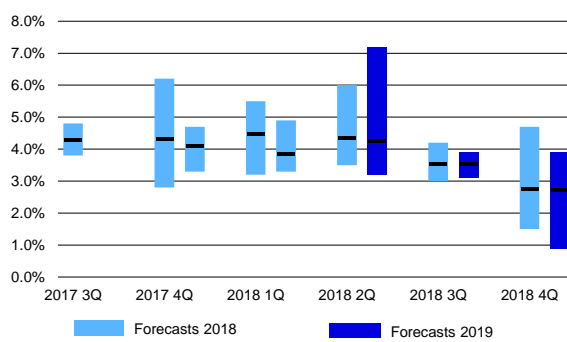

9 Evolution forecasts investments in construction



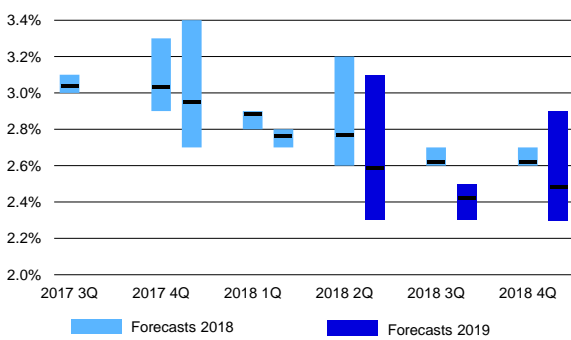

10 Evolution forecasts exports of goods



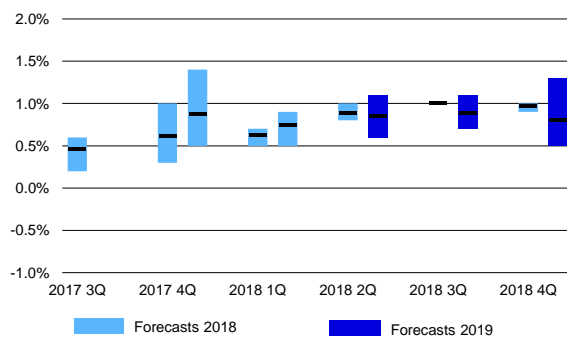

11 Evolution forecasts unemployment rate

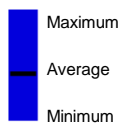

12 Evolution forecasts rate of price increase



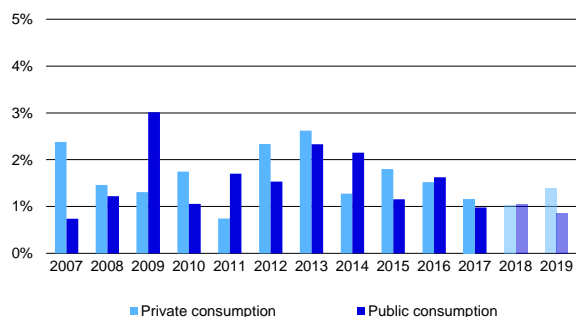

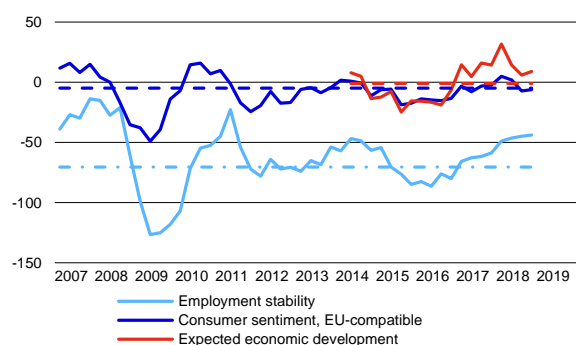

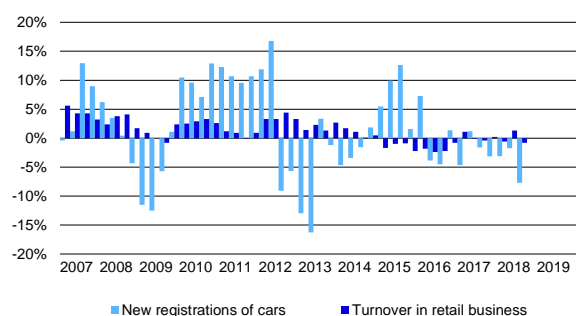

16 Changes turnover in retail business and new registrations of cars

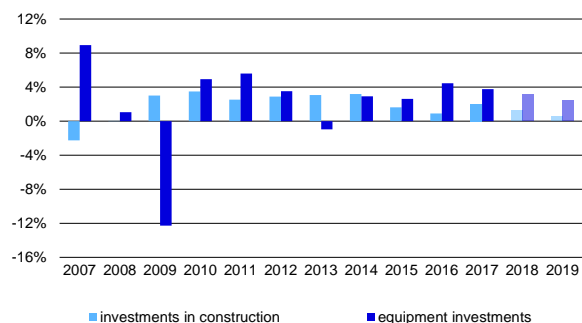

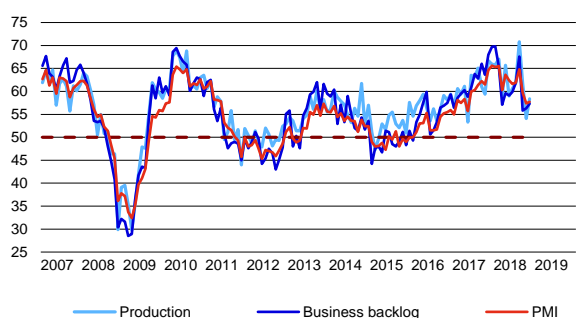

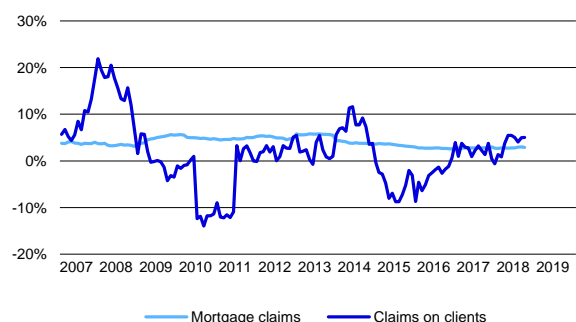

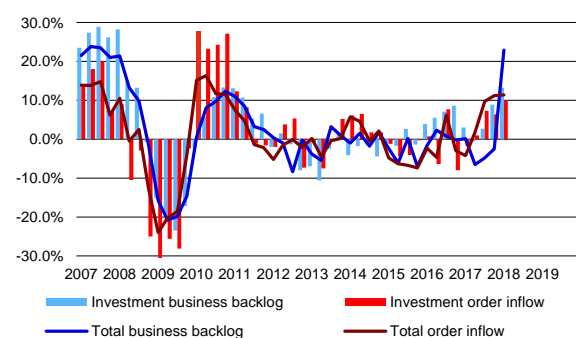

20 Changes order inflow and balance of capital goods

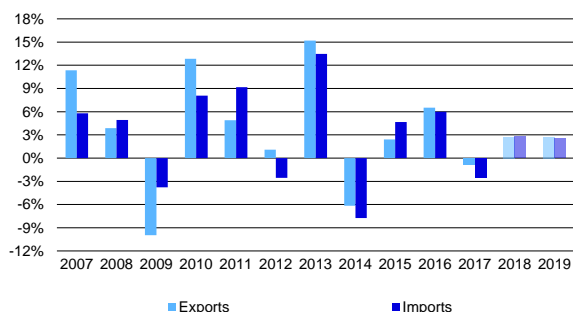

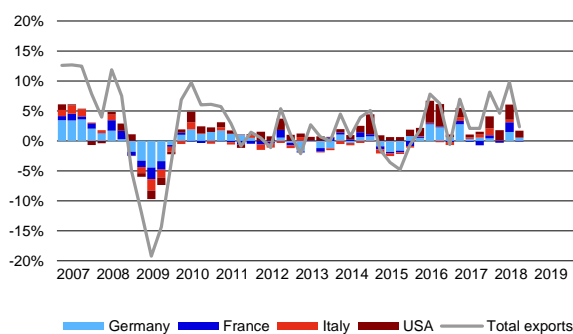

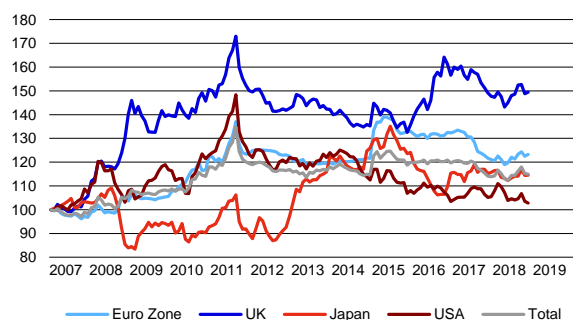
22 Changes in exports to Germany, France, Italy, USA: contribution to growth in export volume

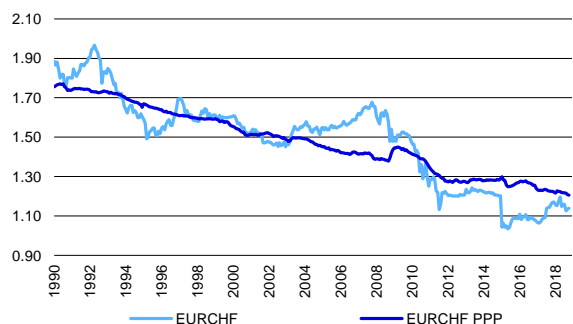
23 Real effective exchange rate index (CPI-based)

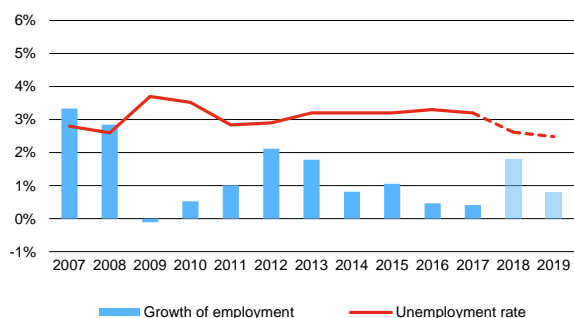

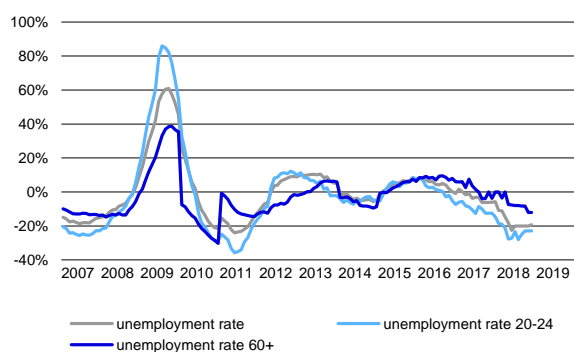
25 Unemployment rate

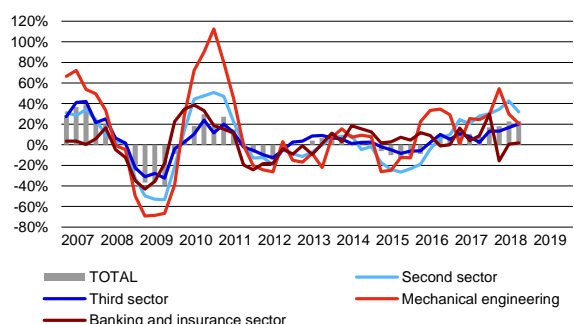

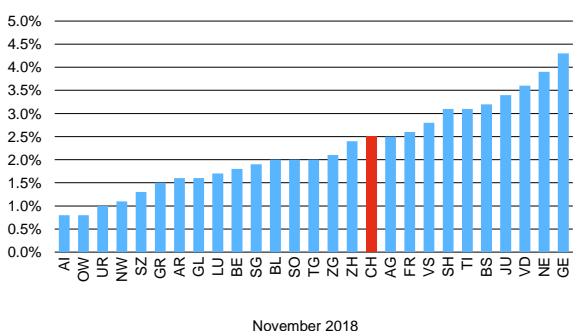

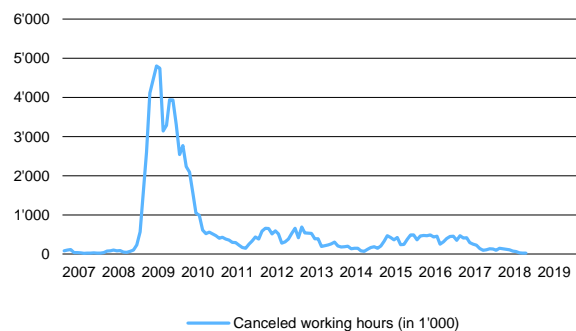

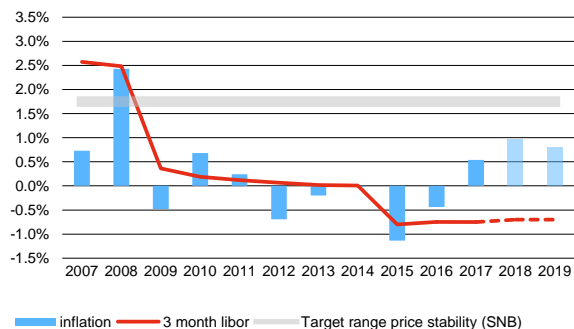

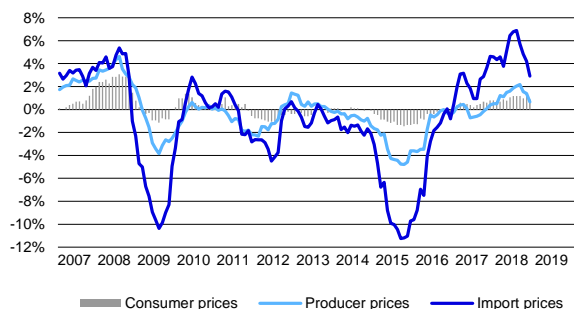

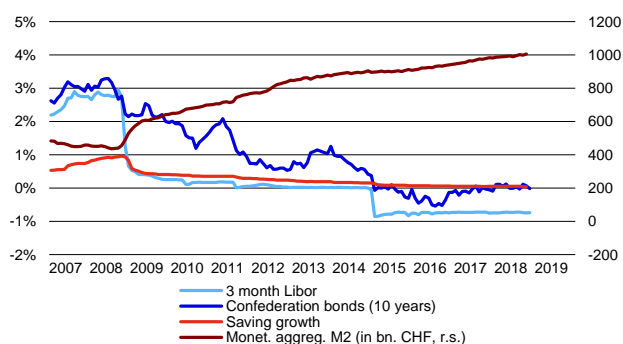

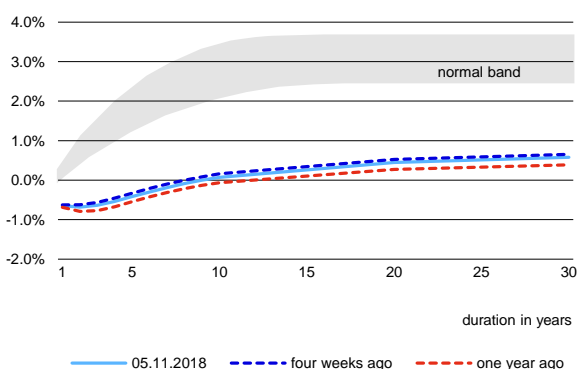

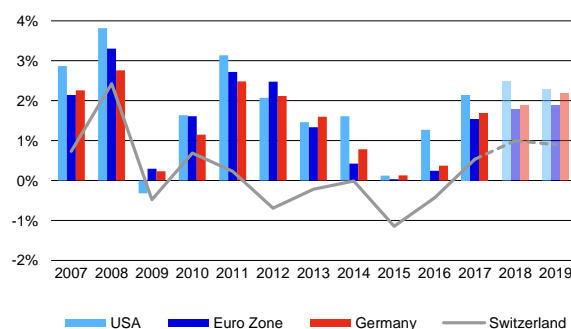

35 International GDP



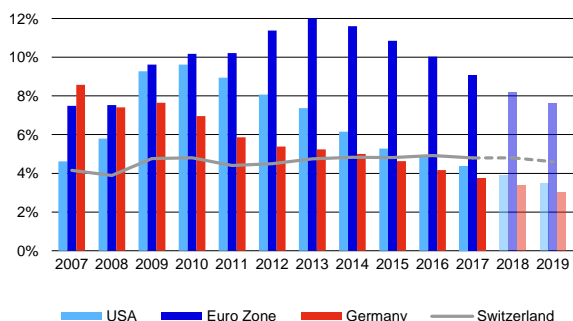

36 International expectations inflation



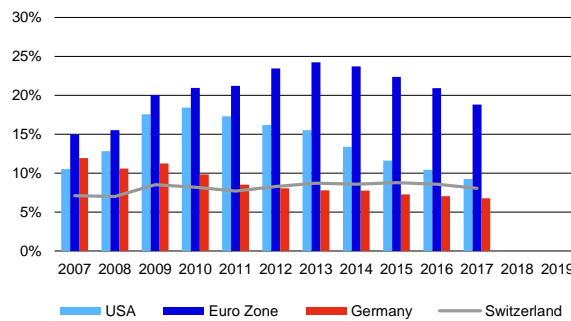

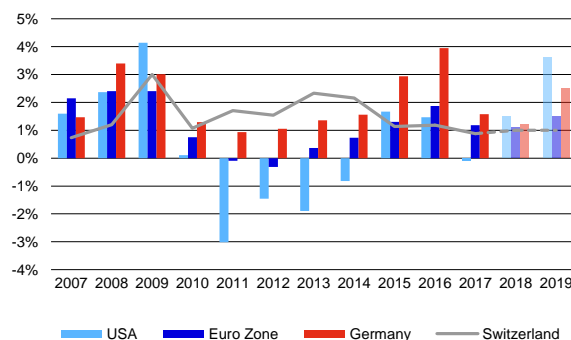

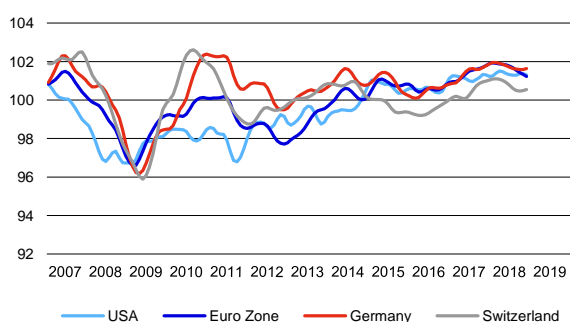
41 International public consumption

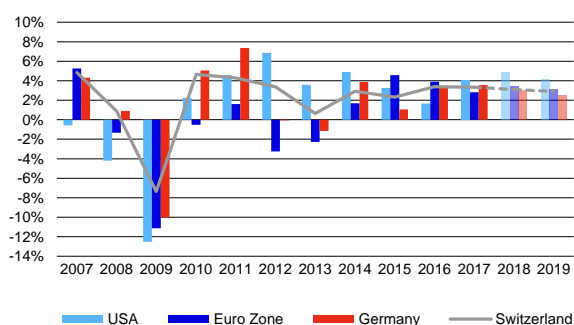

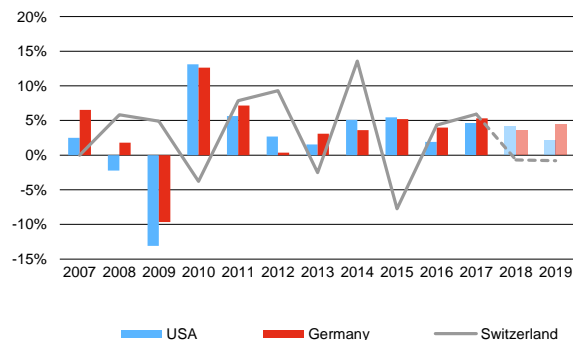

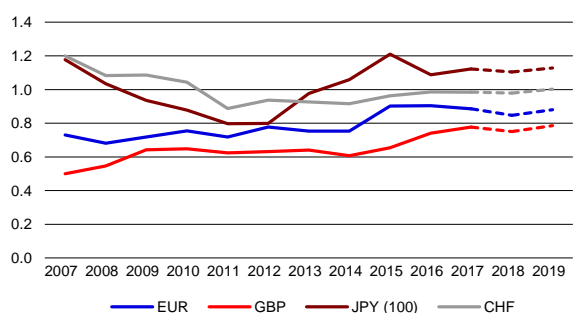

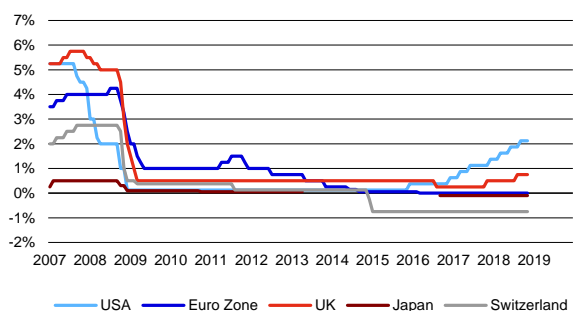
47 Nominal exchange rates USD

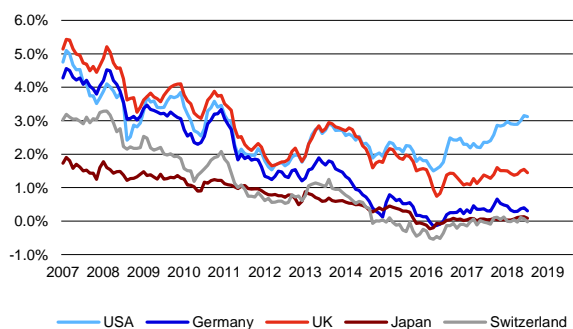

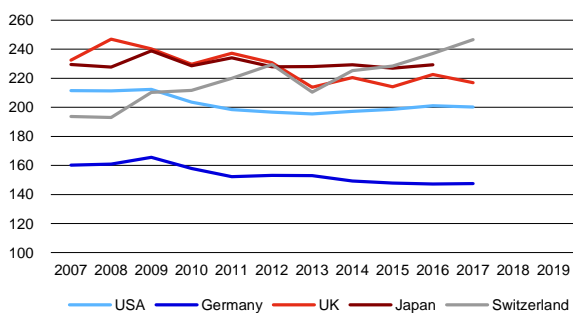

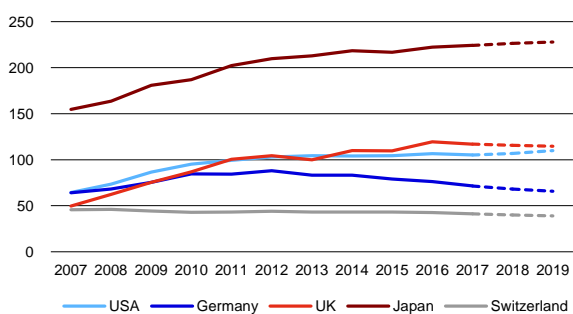
